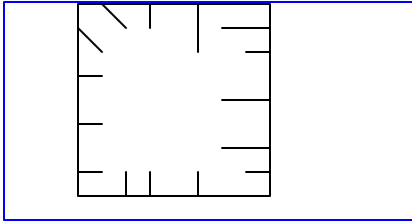




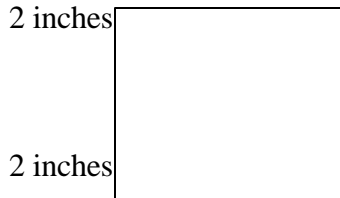
Suggestions for Bag Making

Choose a sturdy, colorful, washable fabric suitable for small children. Do not put drawstrings on the bags as that can be a safety issue. Material is available at the High River Library, Okotoks Library or call Literacy for Life Foundation at 652-5090 or literacy@telus.net

1. Cut a piece of fabric approximately 38 “ by 14 “
2. Finish all the edges. (pink, serge.....)

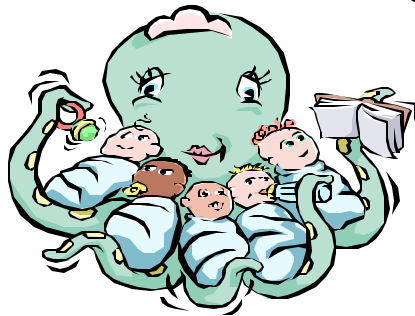


3. Fold under about 2” top and bottom. Press.



4. Fold in the middle right sides together and stitch sides. Turn bag right side out.
5. Prepare 2 handles – about 14” by 2” finished. **(No string handles for safety reasons) The handles are like the ones on a cloth shopping bag.**
6. Attach handles to bag
7. Drop off at designated locations.

What is Books for Babies?

- ☺ All parents with new babies that live in the Municipal District of Foothills receive a bag which includes a board book, scholastic book, baby's first library card, information on reading to your baby and things to do and watch for in the baby's growth.
- ☺ Public Health Nurses give out the bags at the first home visit. If visit is missed parents can pick up bag at Health Unit.
- ☺ An envelope is also given out to parents at the 18-month visit. This includes another book, a new library membership, and information on child development and eye care.

Why is this program important?

- 📖 1 in 3 adults in Alberta have reading skills that limit their ability to deal with much of the written material they encounter every day. One in seven adults is at the lowest literacy level. They have serious difficulty dealing with printed materials.
- 📖 Research has shown there is a close link between literacy and the status of an individual's health and their social and emotional well being.
- 📖 Parents are their child's first and most important teachers. Literacy development begins at birth. Language development is key to the child learning to read and write.

Librarians report an increase in the number of Board Books parents are asking for to read to their babies. The bags are well used by the parents that receive them and are a familiar sight at the libraries. Two years after mother child pairs received guidance and a book they were two times more likely to report enjoyment in reading than the controls that received guidance and no book.
